Out of the 328 subject access requests, we have required an extension from the applicant for 10 of these. As these were complex requests that required additional time to complete, the applicants were kept informed throughout the process.
- 3. How many staff are usually contacted to provide data to contribute to the request? We do not keep track of how many staff members are contacted to provide information regarding subject access requests. As each subject access request is unique, this may vary from request to request.
- 4. On average how many hours are spent dealing with a SAR? We do not hold this information as we do not record the time staff and the legal team spend working on each subject access request.
- 5. Do you have any software to assist with SAR production and if so, which? We do not use a specific software to assist with SAR production.
